FERPA

Family Educational Rights & Privacy Act: Guarantees parent access to their child's education record, and restricts who can access and use student information.



COPPA

Children's Online Privacy Protection Act: controls what information is collected from young children via companies who operate websites, games, and mobile applications marketed to children who are under 13 years of age.



PPRA

Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment: outlines restrictions for the process where students might be asked for information as a part of federally funded surveys and evaluations.
